Evaluating the effectiveness of all research methods (questionnaires, interviews, observations, experiments and secondary data).</p>	<p><b>Crime and Deviance</b></p> <p>Data on crime, victim surveys and self-report studies, the social construction of crime, sociological explanations for crime and deviance, forms of social control, factors affecting criminal and deviant behaviour (race, social class, gender, age).</p>
<b>Year 11</b>	<p><b>Crime and Deviance</b></p> <p>Treatment of criminals and the prison system, rehabilitation and punishment with reference to sentencing and charging.
